

# Greatest PHL Championship Runs

A historical ranking of completed PHL championship seasons through 2025. The comparison considers regular-season performance, playoff results, individual production, team balance, strength of competition, postseason dominance and historical context. Earlier seasons are more difficult to compare because detailed playoff records are incomplete for portions of the league's early history.

\*2016's approximately 7-2 playoff record is a reconstruction from the known nine-game championship postseason and documented five-game Finals, rather than a clean team-output record.

## 1. Gerry Santos / Ramon Santiago - 2021

**42-12 regular season, 7-3 playoffs.** Gerry produced 178 points in 10 playoff games (17.80 PPG), the second-highest postseason point total on record, along with a league-record 28.8 playoff PER. Ramon added 50 points. The combination of an excellent regular season and Gerry's historic postseason workload makes this the top championship run in this ranking.

## 2. Gerry Santos / Steve Seeley - 2015

**43-11 regular season.** Gerry set the PHL single-postseason scoring record with 183 points in 11 games (16.64 PPG). The championship also came through a postseason field featuring Sylvester Santos Jr.'s 134-point run, adding to the strength of the competition.

## 3. Dave Desnoyers / Wayne Gomes - 2017

**48-6 regular season, 7-1 playoffs - 55-7 combined.** Dave scored 103 playoff points at 12.88 PPG and Wayne added 101 at 12.63. Their exceptional balance, dominant record and successful title defense make this one of the strongest complete team seasons in PHL history.

## 4. Dave Desnoyers / Wayne Gomes - 2016

**46-8 regular season.** Dave scored 126 playoff points at 14.00 PPG as the partnership captured the first half of its back-to-back championships. The title run included a five-game Finals and came against a postseason field in which Gerry Santos scored 134 points at 14.89 PPG.

## 5. Bubba Andrews / Dave Desnoyers - 2012

**47-7 regular season.** The team posted one of the strongest regular-season records among PHL champions. Dave, officially a first-year B player, added 107 playoff points at 11.89 PPG. In hindsight, his immediate high-level production made this an unusually powerful A/B pairing.

## 6. Bobby Almeida / Troy Lewis - 2013

**24-24 regular season, 9-0 playoffs.** After a .500 regular season, the team became unbeatable in the postseason. Bobby scored 122 points in nine games (13.56 PPG), and the perfect playoff record remains one of the league's clearest examples of postseason dominance.

## 7. Tom Wolfe / Marc Rousseau - 2024

**36-18 regular season, 7-0 playoffs.** Entering the season behind two teams in the preseason rankings, Shoe-Ter McGavin completed an undefeated postseason that included two shutouts. The combination of a strong regular season, playoff perfection and championship finish gives this run significant upset and dominance value.

## 8. Ronnie Raymond / Casey Santos - 2014

**24-30 regular season.** The team produced one of the league's great postseason turnarounds. Casey scored 137 points in 12 playoff games while Ronnie added 126, giving the champions two of the highest recorded individual postseason totals. They also prevented the defending 2013 champions from repeating.

## 9. Wayne Gomes / Brian Custodio - 2022

**45-9 regular season, 7-1 playoffs.** Wayne scored 119 points in eight playoff games (14.88 PPG), one of the strongest championship postseason scoring rates on record. The team combined regular-season dominance with an equally strong playoff run.

## 10. Gerry Santos / Joe Morin - 2011

**31-23 regular season.** Gerry scored 166 points in 12 playoff games (13.83 PPG), still the third-highest single-postseason point total in league history. The sustained production across a long playoff path makes the 2011 title one of the league's most notable individual-led championship runs.

## 11-15

**2018 - Chris Kelly / Arthur Poirier:** 31-23 in the regular season followed by a perfect 7-0 postseason. Chris scored 84 playoff points (12.00 PPG), while Arthur added 59.

**2023 - Casey Santos / Devin Santos:** 33-21 regular season and 9-1 playoffs. Devin scored 126 points at 12.60 PPG, while Casey contributed 94, giving the champions strong production from both positions.

**2020 - Kyle Daniels / Joe Zuber:** 18-9 in the shortened regular season and 7-2 in the playoffs. Kyle scored 119 points at 13.22 PPG and Joe added 82.

**2019 - Casey Santos / Tom Wolfe:** 33-21 regular season and 7-2 playoffs. Tom scored 109 playoff points and Casey 100, making this one of the more balanced championship scoring performances.

**2025 - Casey Santos / Jake Dupree:** 26-28 regular season followed by a 7-2 postseason. Casey scored 110 playoff points at 12.22 PPG, helping power a strong postseason turnaround.

## About the early-era rankings

Positions 16-20 should not be read as a judgment that those championship teams were weaker. Detailed playoff statistics from portions of 2006-2010 are unavailable, and several statistics were not yet tracked. Those seasons therefore cannot be evaluated with the same statistical depth as later championships.

## Overall perspective

The highest-ranked championships represent different forms of greatness. The 2021 title stands out for individual postseason responsibility; 2017 for complete-season team dominance and balance; 2013 and 2024 for perfect playoff records; and 2014 for an exceptional postseason turnaround. The ranking is intended to compare the full path to a championship rather than simply identify the team with the best regular-season record or the highest-scoring individual player.

*PHL historical analysis. Rankings combine available league statistics and documented historical context. Incomplete early-era records limit direct comparison with later seasons.*
